

## Gregorini—Connolly.

PARIS, June 16.—Miss Grace Connolly, niece of the Marchioness of Anglesey, was married this afternoon to M. Ugo Gregorini, son of Col. Bingham Gregorini of Bologna. The civil marriage ceremony was performed yesterday in the Mayor's office in the Rue d'Anjou. A Catholic marriage was solemnized in the Church of St. Pierre de Chaillot at 9:45 o'clock this morning, and the final ceremony took place in the American Church (Protestant) at 3:30 o'clock this afternoon, the Rev. John B. Morgan officiating.

The bride was given away by her uncle, Henry King. Count Dion attended the groom as best man. The bridesmaids were Miss Edith Beach Grant, Miss Selby Hunt, Miss Van Wart, Miss Isabel Hart, Miss Winifred Paget, and Miss Beatrice Paget, all of whom wore pale blue. The bride wore a white satin dress with a half-long train, trimmed with flounces of white chiffon, a garland of orange blossoms from the shoulder to the skirt, and a tulle veil fastened with a diamond tiara, the gift of the Marchioness of Anglesey.

After the ceremony a reception was held at the residence of the Marchioness of Anglesey, 1 Rue Marbeuf.

Among the guests at the reception were J. B. Eustis, United States Ambassador, and Mrs. Eustis; the Marquis and Marchioness of Dufferin, Count Hoyos, Austrian Ambassador; the Countess Hoyos, Mr. and Mrs. Terence Blackwood, Mrs. Ayer, Miss Gould, the Prince and Princess of Polignac, Baron and Baroness de Rothschild, and Livingston Boyd.
